


DR. BIDHAN CHANDRA ROY,

MRCP, FRCS (Bengali:) (July 1, 1882 Bankipore in Patna, Bihar–July 1, 1962).

e was the second Chief Minister of West Bengal, India. He remained in his post for 14 years as a Congress Party candidate, from January, 14, 1948 until his death in 1962. He was a respected physician and a renowned freedom fighter. He was an alumnus of the Medical College Calcutta of the University of Calcutta.

In India, the National Doctor's Day is celebrated on the date of his birth (and death) July 1 every year. Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy constituted a trust for his properties at Patna for social service and made



eminent nationalist Ganga Sharan Singh (Sinha) the trustee. "We have the ability and if, with faith in our future, we exert ourselves with determination, nothing, I am sure, no obstacles, however formidable or insurmountable they may appear at present, can stop our progress... (if) all work unitedly, keeping our vision clear and with a firm grasp of our problems." The nation honored Dr. Roy with the Bharat Ratna on February 4, 1961. On July 1, 1962, after treating his morning patients and discharging affairs of the State, he took a copy of the "Brahmo Geet" and sang a piece from it. 11 hours later Dr. Roy died. He gifted his house for running a nursing home named after his mother, Aghorkamani Devi. The B.C. Roy National Award was instituted in 1976 for work in the area of medicine, politics, science, philosophy, literature and arts. The Dr. B.C. Roy Memorial Library and Reading Room for Children in the Children's Book Trust, New Delhi, was opened in 1967".

July is month of great pride and honour to all Allopathic Doctors, especially IMA Members. July 1 is celebrated as Doctor's Day in memory of Birth and Death Anniversary of the Doyen of Medical Profession Dr Bidan Chandra Roy. His life time achievements are a source of great inspiration to one and all. He is a role model not only to the Doctors but to everyone who has faith in humanity. REPORT: WORLD ASTHMA DAY

MA Mumbai West celebrated 'World Asthma Day' with a house full and it was a rich academic event on the Sunday, 11th May 2025. The theme of GINA (Global Initiative for Asthma) was "Make inhaled treatment accessible to all". This event was graced by Dr. P. Shamsunder Tampi.

- Dr Avya Bansal started with Defining Asthma as Heterogeneous chronic airway inflammatory disease. It is characterised by wheeze, shortness of breath, chest tightness and cough. Varying with time and intensity. Asthma has a 42% global burden of death in India. Asthma is often undiagnosed. He added that GINA recommends diagnosing through Spirometry and PEF.
- Dr Jayalaxmi specified about diagnosing with History taking, symptoms, physical examination and Spirometry and PEF. He pointed out Associated features like Allergic Rhinitis, atopic dermatitis/eczema and family history of allergens along with Asthma.
- Dr Mehul Thakkar spoke about diagnosing Asthma, where he mentioned that overdiagnosis and underdiagnosis of asthma are very common. Respiratory symptoms are often nonspecific like multiple differential diagnosis for dyspnoea and cough. He pointed out that globally, most clinicians do not have (timely) access to (quality) spirometry. He advocated the use of PEF (Peak Expiratory Flow), though less reliable; if spirometry is not available. To summarize, the Lung function has both mechanical and gas exchange components. PFTs can qualify both.
- Dr Tampi spoke about treatment of stable asthma. Stable asthma refers to a state where individuals with Asthma are experiencing good control of their symptoms and have minimal or no exacerbations. This means they are able to maintain normal activity levels and their breathing difficulties are well managed with their prescribed treatment. Key characteristics of stable asthma are 1. Good symptom control 2. Limited use of rescue medications. They require Short Acting Beta Agonists (SABA) infrequently, typically no more than twice a week.3. Stable lung Function. Measured by Peak Expiratory Flow Rate. PEFR or Forced Expiratory Volume in one second FEV1 is within normal limits.
- Dr Priti Meshram spoke of what not to do in an acute asthma attack. Her advice was Do not delay in administering essential treatment bronchodilators SABA, ipratopium, the nebuliser/mdi with spacer and anti inflammatory therapy and steroids. Not to use beta blockers, N SAIDs, and sedatives that worsen conditions.
- Mrs Rutu spoke about diet in asthma. High protein diet. She cautioned all to Check for allergies. It is important to add Fibre Vit D, Omega 3 Fatty Acids, she said. According to her, foods to be avoided are Dairy, processed foods, allergens and excess salt.
- Imminent panelists in the panel discussion were Dr Bhadresh Dedhia, Dr Manoj Bharucha, Dr Sanjay Bhatia, Dr Abhishek Nerurkar and Dr Kinjal Modi.
- Dr Abhishek Nerurkar spoke about NSAIDs, Pain killers will aggravate asthma so need to take care if operating.










- Dr Bharesh Dedhia spoke about Silent chest which needs to be addressed immediately as it can lead to narcolepsy.
- Dr Bharucha spoke about coughs that need to be treated with drugs as it will increase the intra abdominal pressure and hernia operation will be difficult. Dr Kinjal Modi was the moderator of this panel discussion.
- Dr Sanjay Bhatia said Allergic Rhinitis needs to be controlled with steroids. AR and Asthma are IgE mediated allergies, triggered by similar allergens and have inter related inflammatory and pathophysiological mechanisms. Therefore Asthma, and AR should be treated and Handled as 'One clinical entity' in order to achieve optimal disease control.
- Dr Prashant Chhajed spoke about Allergic Rhinitis increases the risk of hospitalisation with bronchial asthma. Cysteinyl leukotrienes are potent bronchoconstrictors. Treatment options bronchodilators, antihistamines, intranasal corticosteroids, biological therapy, allergen therapy.
- Dr Snehil Mishra spoke about DVT and pulmonary embolism as well as Goals of DVT management. Her take away points were 1. Symptomatic DVT has a substantial negative impact on a patient's quality of life 2. Poor quality of anticoagulation (failure to maintain therapeutic levels with Vit K Antagonists) is a risk factor for early recurrence 3. Even after 10 years, the risk of VTE recurrence is not zero.
- · Can asthmatics exercise? Ms. Mrinmayee Koltharkar explained about the exercises and asthma. and how it helps them.



Dr. Shetty highlighted the concerning prevalence of hypertension in India, affecting approximately **24–30% of the urban population** and **14% of the rural population**. Alarmingly, while 81% of hypertensives receive some form of treatment, only **40% achieve adequate BP control**. A rising trend in hypertension among young adults was noted as a major public health concern.

He emphasized the importance of early detection to reduce long-term cardiovascular risk and organ damage. A key point was the recognition of **masked hypertension**, where clinic BP readings appear normal but ambulatory BP monitoring (ABPM) reveals elevated levels.

 Clinically validated BP measurement device; an automated device measuring BP at the brachial artery Step 1 is recommended. Prepare the patient (including talking, or being talked to in-person or on the phone). • The healthcare professional should explain the procedure, including the number of BP measurements Step 4 Use the arm with the higher SBP readings during an initial visit, unless a new medical condition The measurement (e.g., arm ischemia) has developed in the interim in that arm. procedure • >2 measurements should be obtained at least 30 seconds apart; the values should be averaged and [see figure below] recorded.


Topic: Newer Pharmacological Advances in Resistant Hypertension

Dr. Dargad discussed emerging therapies for difficult-to-control hypertension, including:

- **Zilbesiran** (200 mg SC): A novel RNAi therapeutic with BP-lowering effects lasting up to 6 months.
- Lorundrostat, Aprocitentan, Aliskiren and Finerenone: New agents under research or clinical use.

He also mentioned **renal denervation** as a potential intervention, currently undergoing controlled trials.

Topic : Future of Diagnosis and Therapy in Hypertension

Dr. Shah provided insights into future diagnostic modalities, particularly Alpowered, cuffless BP monitoring devices, which aim to revolutionize hypertension management. He encouraged clinicians to adapt to evolving technologies for improved patient care.

Dr. Sharad Sheth

Topic : Interplay Between Hypertension and Kidney Health

Dr. Seth elaborated on how uncontrolled hypertension accelerates chronic kidney disease (CKD) progression. Normally, 0.7 mL/min/1.73m² of GFR is lost per year due to aging, but in uncontrolled hypertension, the loss can exceed 10 mL annually. Once BP exceeds 160 mmHg, kidneys face hypoxia-induced damage, ultimately impairing glomerular function. India has a CKD prevalence of 16.8%, often undiagnosed until late stages.

Dr. Suresh Sawardekar

Topic: Importance of Ambulatory Blood Pressure Monitoring (ABPM)


Dr. Sawardekar emphasized that nearly 30% of clinic-based hypertension diagnoses may be inaccurate, underscoring the need for 24-hour ABPM. He explained different BP dipping patterns: normal dipper, non-dipper, reverse dipper, and extreme dipper, which have varying prognostic implications.

Dr. Subhash Sonawala

Topic: Role of Diuretics in Hypertension Management

Dr. Sonawala reviewed the pharmacodynamics of thiazide, loop, and potassium-sparing diuretics. While effective, diuretics require careful monitoring for side effects such as electrolyte imbalances, hypokalemia, hyperuricemia, dehydration, and glucose intolerance.

Diuretics help lower blood pressure by reducing fluid volume. They are among the first-line treatments for hypertension.




Dr. Ashok Sirsat

Topic: Hypertension and Stroke Risk

Dr. Sirsat stressed that over two-thirds of stroke cases are directly linked to hypertension. He advocated for maintaining BP within 135/85 to 140/90 mmHg to prevent both hypoperfusion & hypertensive emergencies (e"180/120 mmHg).

Emerging wearable devices like WHOOP bands offer continuous monitoring of BP, ECG, and pulse. He also explained the importance of MRI in differentiating ischemic vs. hemorrhagic stroke & discussed Posterior Reversible Encephalopathy Syndrome (PRES) as a unique neurological presentation.

• BP therapy indication:

BP therapy is recommended for previously untreated patients with ischaemic stroke or TIA who, after the initial days, have a sustained BP of e"140 mmHg systolic or e"90 mmHg diastolic

• Target BP goals:

While the specific goals for target BP should be individualized, it is generally considered reasonable to aim for a systolic BP of <140 mmHg and a diastolic BP of <90 mmHg.

Lacunar stroke considerations:

For patients with a recent lacunar stroke, a more stringent target of systolic BP <130 mmHg might be appropriate.

Dr. Venkat Nagarajan

Topic: Arrhythmias in Hypertensive Patients

Dr. Nagrajan, an electrophysiologist, shared that uncontrolled BP increases the risk of arrhythmias, including:

- Supraventricular tachycardia (SVT)
- Atrial fibrillation
- Ventricular arrhythmias
- Bradyarrhythmias
- Nocturnal arrhythmias seen in obstructive sleep apnea (OSA)

Such arrhythmias may contribute to **sudden cardiac death**, making early identification and management essential.

Panel Discussion

Moderator: Dr. Subhash Sonawala

Topic: Resistant Hypertension – Diagnostic and Therapeutic Challenges

Resistant hypertension is defined as BP >140/90 mmHg despite optimal doses of three antihypertensives, including a diuretic. Panelists recommended evaluating for **secondary** causes such as:

- Endocrine disorders
- Neurological abnormalities (e.g., intracranial masses)
- Renal disorders (e.g., CKD, renal artery stenosis)
- Psychological stress
- Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA)
- Coarctation of the aorta

Management of hypertensive crises includes **IV labetalol**, and in cases related to dialysis, **IV hydralazine**.









Step 1

Exclude other causes of hypertension, including secondary causes, white-coat effect and medication nonadherence

Ensure low sodium diet (<2400 mg/day) Maximize lifestyle interventions:

- ≥6 hours uninterrupted sleep
- Overall dietary pattern
- Weight loss
- Exercise

Optimize 3-drug regimen Ensure adherence to 3

antihypertensive agents of different classes (RAS blocker, CCB, diuretic) at maximum or maximally tolerated doses. Diuretic type must be appropriate for kidney function.*

Substitute optimally dosed thiazide-like diuretic: ie, chlorthalidone or indapamide* for the prior diuretic.

Add mineralocorticoid receptor antagonist (MRA): spironolactone or eplerenone**

Note: Steps 4-6 are suggestions on the basis of expert opinion only and these steps should be individualized.

Step 4

Check heart rate: unless <70 beats/min, add beta blocker (eg, metoprolol succinate, bisoprolol) or combined alpha-beta blocker (eg, labetalol, carvedilol). If beta blocker contraindicated, consider central alpha-agonist (ie, clonidine patch weekly or guanfacine at bedtime). If these are not tolerated, consider once daily diltiazem.

Step 5

Add hydralazine*** 25 mg three times daily and titrate upward to max dose; in patients with congestive heart failure with reduced ejection fraction, hydralazine should be administered on background isosorbide mononitrate 30 mg daily (max. dose 90 mg daily).

Substitute minoxidil**** 2.5 mg two to three times daily for hydralazine and titrate upward. If BP still not at target, consider referral to a hypertension specialist and/or for ongoing experimental studies-www.clinicaltrials.gov

- These diuretics maintain efficacy down to estimated glomerular filtrations rates of 30ml/min/1/73m²
- ** Use caution if eGFR < 30 mL/min/1.73m2</p>
- *** Require concomitant use of a beta blocker and a diuretic








REPORT : IMPACTING MANAGEMENT OF COMMUNITY -ACOUIRED PNEUMONIA

Dear Doctor.

City of Mumbai is at high risk for Vector Borne Diseases such as Malaria, Dengue and Chikungunya due to contributing factors like climate change, high population density, heavy and intermittent rains and poor health seeking behaviour. Government of India has declared target of Malaria Elimination by 20 27. To achieve this target, it is very important to eliminate malarial parasite and follow test, treat and track strategy as well as vector control.

As you are aware that, infected mosquito bites healthy individual and transmission continue as Man-Mosquito-Man cycle. To break the cycle, it is very crucial to diagnose early and completely treat the patient and eliminate the parasite from human body and simultaneously work on Vector Control Measures.

The BMC Public Health Department is putting tremendous efforts for control of vector and also to improve the access for early diagnosis and complete treatment for patients free of cost. Approx 50% of patients seek care in private sector, which requires attention and contribution from private practitioners to eliminate Malaria Parasite.

Malaria is a notifiable disease, as per the provisions of the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897 (Act No. 3 of 1897), Please read National Strategic Plan (Link - https://ncvbdc.mohfw.gov.in/Doc/National-Strategic-Plan-Malaria-2023-27.pdf) for your reference (preferably Annexure: 6). As per National guidelines, Plasmodium Vivax malaria needs 14 days of Radical Treatment (RT) with Primaquine and for Plasmodium Falciparum 3 days of complete treatment with 1 day Radical Treatment (RT) with Primaquine. (Link - https://ncvbdc.mohfw.gov.in/Doc/National-Drug-Policy-2013.pdf)

It is observed that many private sector patients do not complete RT and chain of transmission continues. While reporting has improved; now it is time to ensure complete treatment for each and every patient in both Public and Private sector.

To ensure proper record keeping and treatment monitoring, all PMPs / Private Hospitals / Nursing Homes are requested to STAMP the patient's case paper as per attached format. This stamp will serve as a confirmation that the patient has received the appropriate treatment and has been counselled as per the prescribed standards.

By this communication, We hereby request all the Private Practitioner / Physicians / Private Hospitals to ensure strict adherence to guidelines and collaboration with local ward health authorities to help mitigate the risk of malaria outbreaks and join hands in the battle against Malaria with BMC and make Mumbai Malaria free.

Subject: - Mixopathy - IMA Policy Statement

Respected Sir,

Greetings from Indian Medical Association (HQs.)!

It is unfortunate that the Union Government seems to go ahead with its plans to unscientific mixing of systems of medicine. Reports indicate that the first integrative course mixing MBBS and BAMS would be started in the premier institution of JIPMER, Pondicherry.

IMA has pointed out several times that mixing of systems which are incompatible is an irreversible catastrophe. The life expectancy of an Indian has risen from mere 32 years in 1947 to 70.8 years in 2025. This has been possible because of eradication of diseases like smallpox and neonatal tetanus by vaccines and access to modern maternal and child health care. Role of antibiotics and other modern drugs in treating diseases like Tuberculosis, plague, cholera and Typhoid was a significant contributor. Advances in cancer care, advent of insulin and other drugs for Diabetes and Hypertension as well as huge strides in managing heart diseases and stroke have a significant role.

Not only China miserably failed in its experiment of mixing modern medicine and Chinese Traditional medicine this also resulted in decimation of their traditional medicine. In any case China is not India's role model in Health Care. We have a robust chain of Hospitals and Public Health services. With 779 medical colleges and 136325 MBBS doctors per year India has the largest number of medical colleges. In southern states the Doctor Population ratio has plummeted to below 1:500. Apart from any thing else India is the frontier of medicine today. Infrastructure and expertise exists to undertake any medical intervention at a fraction of the cost than elsewhere. Indian doctors are the backbone of medical services in several western countries.

IMA fails to see any compelling reason or logic in the ill advised Government move. IMA firmly believes that this misadventure will set back Health Care by a century. There are reasons to believe that this would be catastrophic to Ayurveda as well. Having failed to convince the Government IMA has no option but to take the people into confidence. IMA appeals to the nation to resist this indiscretion for the Health of future generations. IMA appeals to qualified Ayurvedic physicians to defend their system. IMA respects all systems of medicine for their historic legacy. Let it be the choice of the patient to choose the system. Mixopathy takes away the right of the patient to chose care of his/her choice. Let all systems retain their pristine purity. Refrain from producing hybrid doctors who will be only qualified quacks.

Agenda 5: To adopt the Annual Report of the Managing Committee covering all the activities of the branch. (The original reports of the other committees shall be appended to the above report) and to adopt various committee reports including the reports of CGP & AMS.

Hon, Secretary, Dr. Rashmi Mehta read out a synopsis of the annual report.

- We have done major programs with IMA HQs and have followed IMA HQ Directives for conducting various activities:
 - We started with a major HQ program at our branch on 21st April, with a live relay to 5 centres across India - at IMA Lucknow, Gwalior, Hyderabad, Vijayawada & Vadodara. The Chief Guest was HSG IMA HQ, Dr AnilKumar Nayak. We had a Walkathon, free vitamin B12 testing, scientific talks and a vitamin B enriched breakfast and lunch.
 - Violence against doctors is a major issue and the heinous rape murder of the resident doctor at R.G. Kar Medical College, Kolkata put IMA HQ in agitation mode. There was a call for a nationwide strike on 17th - 18th August and we also participated in it as well as conducted a protest.
 - Another program conducted with HQ was the Headache algorithm CME.
 - AMR pledge was taken by IMA Mumbai West members on 23rd June along with panel discussion on anti microbial resistance.
 - It is a matter of great pride that as part of Doctors Day celebrations on 1st July 2024, all the three speakers at HQs were from IMA Mumbai West branch.
 - We will be hosting the IMA HQs OB and State Presidents & Secretaries meeting on 22nd / 23rd March.
- With IMA Maharashtra State, not only have we followed their directives but we even hosted the 2nd State Executive of Maharashtra State on 11th August, 2024. We







are actively campaigning for the MMC Elections as part of IMA Maharashtra State united panel.

- We have celebrated World Days such as World Asthma Day, World Hypertension Day, World Heart Day, World Mental Health Day, International Nurses Day, International Women's Day, World Kidney Day and even had a special oration on World AIDS Day.

- International Nurses Day was a very successful program with more than 100 nurses and paramedical staff attending the training program on 11th May.
- We had interesting inputs for participants in the form of crossword puzzles during Nurses's day and World Hypertension day programs.
- Our Annual Scientific Conference this year had many firsts to its credit and was a mega event. Conducted over three days, the last day had parallel sessions, running







in 2 lecture halls. Spanning over three days, there were a total of 38 lectures, two panel discussions, and an oration.

- A major milestone this year was the completion of building repair and renovation work. The refurbished building is the cynosure of all eyes and we have had an increase in our hall bookings gradually.
- As per guidelines from IMA HQs and IMA MS, Mumbai West branch has been in the forefront even in the political activity. - Letter had been received from the family of late Dr Surabhai C. Sheth about the
 missing of his name from the building after renovation. The matter was discussed in
 the office bearers and managing committee meeting, and it was decided to make
 new plaques commemorating his invaluable contribution towards obtaining the
 land on lease on which the IMA Mumbai West building stands as well as arranging for
 some funds for construction of the building. The house approved that the plaques
 ought to be put up.
- 2. Dr Rashmi Mehta informed the house that at present discounted scheme for membership of IMA HQ was going on. The HFC rates were going to increase by 15% from 1st April. It was left to the general body to decide whether a corresponding increase of our branch share should be done. Opinions were given by Dr S. K. Joshi, Dr Rashmikant Sanghvi, Dr Jayesh Lele, Dr Akil Contractor, Dr Sanjay Dudhat, Dr Manoj Patel, Dr Rohini Badwe, Dr Hansa Bheda. Dr Shobha Ahuja said that this opportunity was not given to everybody, and it was an honour to be able to host the meeting. Dr Lele further elaborated that certain preparations had been done and the National President, HSG and National President elect would all stay back for our Annual day celebrations and installation of the new managing committee. Dr Rashmi Mehta said that we had hosted a similar meeting in the year 2016, where the entire meeting was at Hotel Karl Residency. This time, the meeting would be entirely at our branch, including the Finance committee meeting and only accommodation would be done at Hotel Karl Residency. An amount of Rs 8 lakhs was sanctioned for expenses towards the meeting.
- 5. Dr Akil Contractor said that after the Annual conference, Thursday CME activities







had practically stopped. He said that we should plan and continue weekly CME activities. He also said that this year annual fees should be charged. Dr Rashmikant Sanghvi said that we should change our policies for arranging sponsorships. Dr Manoj Patel said that we should reduce the Sponsorship amounts.

6. Dr. Rashmi Mehta informed about the MMC elections that would be held on 3rd April. - 7. Dr Lele proposed the name of Dr Sanjay Dudhat as managing trustee for the year 2025 2026. Dr Inamdar had already consented and Dr. Akil Contractor and Dr Manoj Patel also consented Dr Sanjay Dudhat was congratulated on being the managing trustee for the year 2025 2026.
- 8. Dr Lele said that our website was not secure and hence its link did not open on certain phones and laptops. He suggested to employ an IT person for a secure website. An additional amount would need to be paid, but the website would be secure. Dr Hariani was asked to help out in this. This was approved by the General Body.
- 9. Dr Shobha Ahuja thanked the entire team from President, Dr Ketan Mehta and Secretary, Dr Rashmi Mehta onwards to each and every member of the managing committee, a special thanks to Dr Akil Contractor, Managing Trustee and trustee Dr Jayesh Lele. Felicitation of the outgoing team was done.
