September saw a fresh notification by Government of Maharashtra that allowed registration of CCMP doctors in our MMC register. IMA Maharashtra State has started agitating all over again. It's a

4 FOLD FIGHT:

- 1. Strike/ March to Azad Maidan/ fast to raise awareness
- 2. Political liasioning meeting the Chief Minister, Deputy Chief ministers, Education minister, MPs, MLAs, District Collectors to put pressure for withdrawal of the notification.
- 3. **Legal:** the mainstay of our strategy to make sure that the case outcome is in our favour. The case is sub judice in the High Court since the first notification came in 2014. We have had hearings in the Hon. High Court where the judges have not been equivocally in our favour. We may have to approach the Hon. Supreme Court after the next hearing on 10th November. Please contribute to the IMA Maharashtra State legal fund because this would be expensive. Our High Court battle has been fought by Adv. Kamdar who has not charged a single rupee, courtesy Dr Jayesh Lele sir but the Supreme Court fight would need funds. You will find the IMA MS legal fund QR code in this issue. Please inform us once you have donated for this cause
- 4. Creating awareness in the general public by means of Social media, involving other medical and speciality associations (they are also affected) and NGOs. The focus is



on PATIENT SAFETY and the Medicolegal and insurance nightmares that would occur if a person registered in 2 medical councils treats a patient and it goes wrong.

We have been doing our bit for this issue and request all of you to be actively involved.

Meanwhile, at our branch, we have had some fantastic CMEs. Our Teachers' Day program was a very graceful affair and we were humbled once again when we were able to give Medical Scholarships of Rs 35000/- each to 21 3rd MBBS students

Successful Blood Donation Drives have been conducted in the past month.

Efficacy and Safety of Postbiotic Contained Inactivated Lactobacillus reuteri (Limosilactobacillus reuteri) DSM17648 as Adjuvant Therapy in the Eradication of Helicobacter pylori in Adults: **A Comprehensive Review**

ABSTRACT

Background: Helicobacter pylori infection affects approximately half of the global population and remains a significant clinical challenge due to declining eradication rates and increasing antibiotic resistance. The addition of probiotics and postbiotics to standard eradication therapy has emerged as a promising adjuvant approach.

Objective: This review evaluates the efficacy and safety of postbiotic containing inactivated Lactobacillus reuteri DSM17648 as adjuvant therapy in H. pylori eradication based on recent clinical trials

Methods: We analyzed three major randomized controlled trials examining the use of L. reuteri DSM17648 in H. pylori eradication, including studies from Russia, Malaysia & India involving a total of 309 patients.

Results: The postbiotic demonstrated significant improvements in eradication rates ranging from 20-24% compared to standard therapy alone. Eradication rates improved from 66.7-86.0% in control groups to 86.7-96.7% in postbiotic groups. Additionally, patients experienced reduced gastrointestinal symptoms and fewer treatment-related adverse effects.

Conclusion: Postbiotic containing inactivated L. reuteri DSM17648 represents a safe and effective adjuvant therapy for H. pylori eradication, offering improved outcomes with minimal side effects.

Keywords: Helicobacter pylori, Lactobacillus reuteri, postbiotic, eradication therapy, functional dyspepsia

INTRODUCTION

Helicobacter pylori infection represents one of the most prevalent chronic bacterial infections worldwide, affecting approximately 50% of the global population with significantly higher rates in developing countries. In India, the prevalence reaches as high as 80%, making H. pylori infection a major public health concern. This gramnegative bacterium is recognized as the primary etiological agent of chronic gastritis. peptic ulcer disease, and plays a crucial role in the development of gastric adenocarcinoma and mucosa-associated lymphoid tissue (MALT) lymphoma.

The standard approach to H. pylori eradication has traditionally relied on triple therapy regimens consisting of a proton pump inhibitor (PPI) combined with two antibiotics, typically clarithromycin and amoxicillin. However, the efficacy of these conventional regimens has been steadily declining, with success rates dropping from historical levels of 90% to current rates of 70-80% in many regions. This decline is primarily attributed to increasing antibiotic resistance, particularly to clarithromycin and metronidazole, as well as treatment-related side effects that impact patient compliance.

The emergence of antibiotic resistance has prompted researchers to explore alternative and adjuvant therapeutic approaches. Among these, the use of probiotics and more recently postbiotics has gained significant attention. Postbiotics, also known as











metabiotics or paraprobiotics, are preparations containing inactivated microbial cells and/or their components that confer health benefits when administered in adequate amounts. Unlike living probiotics, postbiotics offer several advantages including improved stability, safety, and standardization.

Lactobacillus reuteri strain DSM17648 has emerged as a particularly promising candidate for H. pylori eradication enhancement. This strain was selected from over 700 Lactobacillus strains due to its unique ability to specifically coaggregate with H. pylori without affecting normal gastric or intestinal microbiota. The strain demonstrates highly specific antagonistic binding to H. pylori cells in artificial gastric juice, reducing their mobility and adhesion ability.

MECHANISM OF ACTION

The therapeutic mechanism of L. reuteri DSM17648 involves multiple pathways that collectively enhance H. pylori eradication:

Coaggregation and Competitive Inhibition

The most distinctive feature of L. reuteri DSM17648 is its ability to specifically coaggregate with different H. pylori strains (types I and II) as well as H. heilmannii, without binding to normal oral or intestinal microbiota. This selective interaction impairs H. pylori's mobility and adhesion to gastric mucosa, facilitating bacterial clearance through natural peristaltic movements.

Immunomodulation and Mucosal Protection

The postbiotic enhances local immune responses and strengthens the gastric mucosal barrier. It stimulates the production of protective factors while modulating inflammatory responses, creating an environment less conducive to H. pylori survival and colonization.

Enhancement of Standard Therapy

When combined with standard antibiotic regimens, L. reuteri DSM17648 appears to have synergistic effects, potentially



overcoming some mechanisms of antibiotic resistance and improving overall treatment efficacy.

CLINICAL EVIDENCE

Study 1: Russian Multicenter Trial (Ivashkin et al., 2024)

This landmark randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled, multicenter study involved 129 H. pylori-positive patients with functional dyspepsia across six centers in Russia. The study design was robust, with patients randomized 1:1 to receive either postbiotic (Pylopass, 200 mg twice daily) or placebo for 28 days alongside standard 14-day triple therapy.

Key Findings:

- **Eradication Rate**: 96.7% in the postbiotic group vs. 86.0% in the placebo group (P= 0.039)
- Symptom Improvement: Significant improvements in gastrointestinal symptoms measured by GSRS scores
- **Safety Profile:** Reduced overall digestive adverse effects in the postbiotic group (P = 0.049)
- Quality of Life: Both groups showed significant improvements in SF-36 scores with no significant differences between groups. The study demonstrated excellent compliance rates (>95% in both groups) and no serious adverse effects were reported in either group.

Study 2: Malaysian Single-Center Trial (Ismail et al., 2023)

This prospective, randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled trial involved 90 treatment-naÃ-ve H. pylori-positive patients in Malaysia. The study protocol included 14 days of standard triple therapy followed by 30 days of either probiotic (L. reuteri DSM17648, 200 mg daily) or placebo.


Key Results:











- Per-Protocol Analysis: 93.2% vs. 68.9% eradication rate (24.3% improvement, P = 0.007)
- **Symptom Relief:** Significant improvements in GSRS scores for indigestion, abdominal pain & constipation
- Adverse Effects: Significantly fewer headaches (0% vs. 15.6%, P = 0.012) and abdominal pain (0% vs. 13.3%, P = 0.026)

This study provided compelling evidence for the effectiveness of L. reuteri DSM17648 in a Southeast Asian population, with one of the largest improvements in eradication rates reported in the literature.

Study 3: Indian Comparative Study (Parth et al., 2021)

This double-centered, prospective interventional study conducted in India involved 90 H. pylori-positive patients, comparing standard triple therapy alone versus triple therapy plus L. reuteri supplementation.

Notable Outcomes:

- **Eradication Rate:** 86.67% in the L. reuteri group vs. 66.67% in the control group (20% improvement)
- Bacterial Load Reduction: Greater reduction in H. pylori load measured by 13C-UBT values
- **Symptom Management:** Significant reduction in GSRS scores from baseline (15.39±4.52) to end of treatment (5.33±2.34)
- **Side Effect Profile:** Reduced incidence of nausea, diarrhea, constipation and taste disturbance

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF CLINICAL OUTCOMES

Eradication Efficacy

Across all three studies, the addition of L. reuteri DSM17648 consistently demonstrated significant improvements in H. pylori eradication rates:



- Russian study: 10.7% absolute improvement (86.0% to 96.7%)
- Malaysian study: 22.2% absolute improvement (68.9% to 91.1%)
- Indian study: 20.0% absolute improvement (66.67% to 86.67%)

The variation in improvement percentages likely reflects differences in baseline resistance patterns, patient populations, and study methodologies.

Symptom Management

All studies demonstrated significant improvements in gastrointestinal symptoms using validated assessment tools (GSRS questionnaires). The postbiotic groups consistently showed greater reductions in:

- Abdominal pain and discomfort
- Indigestion and bloating
- Nausea and reflux symptoms
- Constipation-related complaints

Safety Profile

The safety data across all studies was remarkably consistent, showing:

- No serious adverse events attributed to the postbiotic
- Reduced overall incidence of treatmentrelated side effects
- Specific reductions in common antibioticassociated symptoms such as nausea, diarrhea, and taste disturbances
- Excellent tolerance with compliance rates exceeding 95%

CLINICAL IMPLICATIONS AND PRACTICAL CONSIDERATIONS

Dosing and Administration

The optimal dosing regimen appears to be 200 mg of L. reuteri DSM17648 administered twice daily with meals during the 14-day antibiotic treatment period, followed by continued supplementation for an additional 14-28 days. This extended post-











antibiotic supplementation may help restore normal gastric microbiota and maintain therapeutic benefits.

Patient Selection

The postbiotic has demonstrated efficacy across diverse patient populations, including:

- Treatment-naà ve H.pylori-positive patients
- Patients with functional dyspepsia
- Various age groups and ethnic populations
- Patients with different baseline symptom severities

Integration with Standard Care

L. reuteri DSM17648 can be seamlessly integrated into existing H. pylori management protocols without requiring significant changes to established treatment paradigms. Its use as an adjuvant therapy allows clinicians to maintain proven antibiotic regimens while enhancing their effectiveness

Economic Considerations

While formal cost-effectiveness analyses were not included in the reviewed studies, the improved eradication rates and reduced need for second-line treatments suggest potential economic benefits. The prevention of treatment failures could reduce overall healthcare costs associated with H. pylori management.

FUTURE RESEARCH DIRECTIONS Resistance Pattern Studies

Future research should investigate the effectiveness of L. reuteri DSM17648 in populations with high clarithromycin resistance rates and evaluate its potential to overcome specific resistance mechanisms.

Combination Therapies

Studies examining the postbiotic's efficacy with alternative antibiotic regimens, including bismuth-based quadruple therapy and sequential therapy protocols, would provide valuable insights for optimizing



treatment approaches.

Long-term Follow-up

Extended follow-up studies are needed to assess the durability of eradication achieved with postbiotic supplementation and its impact on H. pylori recurrence rates.

Mechanistic Studies

Further research into the precise molecular mechanisms underlying the synergistic effects between L. reuteri DSM17648 and standard antibiotics could inform the development of next-generation postbiotic therapies.

LIMITATIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS Study Heterogeneity

The reviewed studies varied in design, patient populations, and outcome measures, limiting direct comparison of results. Standardized protocols for future studies would enhance the quality of evidence.

Geographic Variations

The effectiveness of L. reuteri DSM17648 may vary based on regional H. pylori strain characteristics, antibiotic resistance patterns, and population genetics. Additional studies in diverse geographic regions are warranted.

Regulatory Considerations

The regulatory status of postbiotic preparations varies by country, which may impact their availability and implementation in clinical practice.

CONCLUSIONS

The evidence from recent clinical trials provides compelling support for the use of postbiotic containing inactivated L. reuteri DSM17648 as an effective and safe adjuvant therapy for H. pylori eradication in adults. The consistent improvements in eradication rates (ranging from 10.7% to 24.3% across

studies), coupled with enhanced symptom management and reduced adverse effects. position this postbiotic as a valuable addition to current therapeutic approaches. The mechanism of action, involving specific coaggregation with H. pylori, antimicrobial activity, and immunomodulation, provides a scientifically sound rationale for its therapeutic effects. The excellent safety profile, with no serious adverse events reported across studies involving over 300 patients, supports its clinical utility. For healthcare practitioners managing H. pylori infections, particularly in regions with declining eradication rates or high antibiotic resistance, the addition of L. reuteri DSM17648 to standard triple therapy represents an evidence-based strategy to improve treatment outcomes. The postbiotic's ability to enhance eradication rates while simultaneously reducing treatment-related side effects addresses two major challenges in current H. pylori management. As antibiotic resistance continues to threaten the effectiveness of conventional H. pylori eradication regimens. postbiotic adjuvant therapy offers a promising approach to maintain and improve treatment success rates. The growing body of evidence supporting L. reuteri DSM17648 suggests that postbiotics may play an increasingly important role in the future management of H. pylori infections.


